### Production

### Community Survey

Thank you to the 167 parents/caregivers who completed and returned the community survey which was distributed in Term 2. These have now been collated and the findings are listed below. This feedback is very useful when we review and make changes to our teaching and learning programmes.

**Question 1** asked parents what level of importance they placed upon a list of tasks.

The most important were:

1. Learning the basics.
2. Developing social skills, tolerance, respect for others.
3. Developing work and study skills.
4. Teaching good manners.
- 5= Learning, science, social studies and technology.
- 5= Learning to use computers and electronic communications.

**Question 2** asked parents how successful the school was at performing a list of tasks.

The most successful were:

- 1= Giving students a variety of experiences.
- 1= Technicraft.
2. Teaching the basics.
3. Developing social skills.
4. Developing physical skills.

### **Questions 3 to 10**

84.9% of responses indicated that our communication was either very good or excellent.

96.6% of responses rated the school's ability to listen to concerns and take action as either excellent or very good.

99.8% of respondents felt comfortable approaching the school with a problem.

95.1% of respondents felt their children were very safe or reasonably safe at school.

94.4% of respondents rated the effectiveness of discipline as either very good or excellent.

99.9% of respondents felt their children were given equal opportunities regardless of background, race or culture.

99.3% of respondents indicated that interschool activities were either very important or reasonably important.

Parents were also asked to list up to three things they liked best about the school and up to three things they would like changed. I will give you a summary of these comments in the next newsletter.

The Ministry of Education require schools to consult with their Maori community on matters of student
